The Princeton University mathematics department has contributed four AMTNJ Presidents during the first fifteen years of AMTNJ. Henry B. Fine was the second President of AMTNJ in 1915-16 followed by Charles R. MacInnes #7 1920-21, Oswald Veblin #11 1924-25 and Luther P. Eisenhart #14 1927-28.

Fine received his A.B degree from Princeton in 1880 and studied under the famous geometer Felix Klein who was Fine's doctoral advisor at the University of Leipzig in Germany in 1885. Fine returned to Princeton University as an assistant professor 1885-90, became a professor in 1890, dean of faculty from 1903-12 and dean of the department of science after 1909.

MacInnes, Veblin and Eisenhart achieved many academic honors in their own right following Dean Fine's path to making the mathematics department at Princeton a world reknown teaching and pure mathematics research university.
