

Mathematics Buildings Named for Two AMTNJ Presidents

Fine Hall at Princeton University was named for Henry Burchard Fine, AMTNJ President #2 1915-1916, who made Princeton a leading center for mathematics and fostered the growth of other sciences as well. Dean Fine was the first and only dean of the departments of science.

The new Fine Hall was dedicated in 1970. It replaced an older Fine Hall built 40 years earlier for the department of mathematics and was renamed Jones Hall. The three story section contains classrooms and graduate student offices and studies and is connected to a seven story tower.

Mallory Hall at Montclair State University was named for Virgil Sampson Mallory, AMTNJ President #19 1932-1933, who helped establish Montclair State Teachers College nka as Montclair State University as a leading center for producing secondary mathematics teachers.

The half-century old, 34,400-GSF building will be renovated into a state-of-the-art, 43,800-GSF instructional and research facility for the Department of Computer Science. The project will add a fourth floor to the building and will repurpose the existing space to house classrooms for students taking courses or pursuing degrees in Computer Science and Information Technology, as well as for a wide range of highly specialized instructional spaces and research laboratories.
